Fondation Maeght

A private foundation inaugurated in 1964 by André Malraux, then minister for cultural affairs. The building was conceived to present modern and contemporary art in all its forms.

The museum, truly surrounded by nature, possesses one of the largest 20th century art collections: Bonnard, Miro, Bury, Braque, Chagall, ...

Opening hours

The museum is open everyday:

1st October to 30th June from 10.00 to 18.00

1st July to 30th September from 10.00 to 19.00

Vieux St Paul

The history of St Paul is closely linked to that of Vence. Like Vence, St Paul is a medieval village with high ramparts that, many years ago, protected the inhabitants from attack. Today, at the top of the ramparts, one can enjoy an exceptional view of the surrounding countryside.

Amongst the small streets of St Paul, you will discover the Chapel of the 'Penitents Blancs' decorated by Folon, the Collegiate church and the dungeon, a symbol of revolutionary times.



Celebrities

A large number of artists have stayed in St Paul from the 1920s:

Dufy; Renoir,

Chagall (whose body lies in St Paul cemetery). Writers also came to discover this pretty village such as Giono and Cocteau.

Filmstars such as Roger Moore, Yves Montand, have also spent time in St Paul.
